Canberra Alpine Club

The Club was formed on 31 July 1934 at the Alpine Hotel, Kiandra and was incorporated on 29 June 1955 (registration number A.19).

The motion to form the Club was put by Tim Ingram and Tom Campbell at a meeting chaired by H.J. Lamble, then Director of the NSW Government Tourist Bureau. The inaugural general meeting was held at the Hotel Canberra on 11 October 1934 to elect office bearers and a committee and to ratify the provisional operating arrangements.

The Club is governed by a written Constitution, By-laws and the *Associations Incorporation Act 1991*. The present Constitution, which has been subject to minor amendments, was adopted in 1996 and the By-laws are revised annually and circulated each June.

The objects of the Club include promoting snowsports and bushwalking, fostering the conservation of the alpine environment and the interest of members in matters of historical or heritage significance to skiing or bushwalking including the preservation of buildings, sites and objects.

The Club is a corporate member of Snow Australia. The Club is also a member of SLOPES (Ski Lodges of Perisher, Guthega and Smiggins Inc) and of the Kosciuszko Huts Association.

The Mount Franklin Chalet was constructed for the Club in 1938 with bunk accommodation for 32 on leased land. The Chalet reverted to the Government when Namadgi National Park was created in 1984 and was destroyed by bushfires in January 2003, with a new shelter being erected by the ACT Government in 2007. The Mount Franklin precinct is the subject of memoranda of understanding made in 1989 and 1998 between the Club and the ACT Parks and Conservation Service.

The A-frame Perisher lodge was constructed by Club labour in 1961 on land leased from the State of New South Wales. A new lease executed late in 2008 runs until 31 December 2028 – with three 10 year options exercisable after that. This lodge is licensed to accommodate 46 persons and was extended and substantially upgraded in 1983. The bedroom wing was added in 1999, together with wheelchair accessible facilities.

The original Jindabyne lodge was constructed in 1968 on leased land in Banjo Paterson Crescent, adjacent to Lake Jindabyne. Freehold title was acquired in 1992. The original lodge was demolished in late 2013 and a new lodge built, opening in 2014.

Introduction

This report covers the 2019 calendar year, which coincides with the financial year of the Club. It should be read together with the audited financial statements for the Club’s financial year ending 31 December 2019 which have been published as a supplement.

While the report formally covers the calendar year, some information is also provided regarding events between the beginning of 2020 and preparation of this report.

PART 1 – PRESIDENT’S REPORT

It is my pleasure to report on the operations of the Canberra Alpine Club during the year ending 31st December 2019. Before I continue with the formal elements of the report, on behalf of the Club, I would like to extend our thoughts to all those who have been impacted by the tragic bushfires during the Australian Summer. I would also like to thank all the firefighters and emergency services personnel, and the untold numbers of volunteers and donors who have supported them. The Club remains committed to fostering the conservation of the alpine environment, and will continue to look at new ways we can work together to achieve this objective in light of the “new normal” we are experiencing.

Returning to 2019, I am pleased to report that the Club has delivered another extremely strong financial result. After yet another excellent snow season, the Club achieved a record revenue and surplus result for the year, ensuring that we go into 2020 in a very healthy financial position. Importantly, we continue to make significant reductions to our Jindabyne Redevelopment Loan, which now stands at \$420k (reduced from \$1M in five years). Full details of our financial position are contained in the Treasurer’s report and audited accounts.

Membership at the end of 2019 has increased to 548 (of the maximum of 600 allowed by constitution) with the waiting list remaining steady at 64. Attracting and retaining members is vital to the long-term success of the Club, and this will continue to be a key focus for the committee, however it is great to see a continued positive trend in this area.

In 2019, lodge bookings couldn’t quite top the all-time high occupancy levels of 2018, but with almost 6,450 bed/nights in total, this was still an outstanding result. The usage levels were actually at record levels in the early peak period (June-August), but were offset by weaker bookings during late season and off-peak. Increasing lodge usage during off-peak periods remains another focus area. For full details of the lodge occupancy, please refer to Appendix 2.

A number of social events were held during the year in Canberra and at the lodges. These included the Pre-Season Drinks held at EQ Café and Lounge, and the Club Championship Dinner and Brumby Cup Dinner, both held at the Perisher Lodge. The Annual Dinner and Trophy Presentation was held at The Old Canberra Inn in Lyneham in November and was yet another very successful night. Congratulations to Caroline Walker for her award of the Lane-Poole Trophy in 2019, and thank you again for all that you have done to support the Club.

The Club sporting calendar was again full with Brumby Races, XC Championships, Balmain Cup and Perisher Cup, not to mention Interschools Races, ACT Schools Cup, Youth Week and Family Week. Congratulations to all the competitors who participated in these events, particularly the Club Juniors who achieved fantastic results in Interschools and ACT Schools Cup (see Snowsports report for details). While our Balmain Cup team were unable to replicate their success of 2018, and we did not field a team in the Perisher Cup, we look forward to more success in 2020.

Outside of Australian competition, we remain excited every time Laura Peel steps up to compete on the international stage. She warmed up with a silver in the FIS Aerials in Moscow in February, before taking home gold in China in March. She finished 2019 with another bronze in China, and has since gone on to claim another silver and gold in the early part of 2020. This is an absolutely outstanding series of results. In addition, Valentino Guseli continued to impress on the international circuit, winning the Burton US Open Junior and the Groms Slopestyle at the World Rookie Tour in 2019. Congratulations to both for your continued amazing results, the Club is extremely proud of you.

Work parties were conducted throughout the year to continue our important maintenance programs at Jindabyne, Perisher, Mt Franklin and O'Keefes Hut. In particular, this included additional work to complete the program of work at the Perisher Lodge, which is required to finalise our compliance with the 2007 Fire Order. We have now completed all this work, and are in the process of obtaining the final compliance certificates, which will hopefully allow us to sign off with NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service on this.

I would like to thank Club Captain Kristen Guseli, Perisher Lodge Coordinator Peter Richards, Jindabyne Lodge Coordinator Peter Cunningham, Franklin Coordinator Ian McLeod and O'Keefe's Hut Coordinator Paul Oboohov for their continued hard work throughout 2019. In addition, I would like to thank all the volunteers who attended work parties, as well as those who have volunteered as social and sporting event organisers, and as lodge leaders.

I would also like to acknowledge and thank our Administrative Officer, Sarah Forsdyke, who has continued to ensure our bookings and membership functions proceed smoothly, along with providing some beautiful photos via the Club's Facebook page. Thanks again to Jill and Ken French for their ongoing to the management of Perisher Lodge during Peak season. And a huge thank you to Judy Lejins for her tireless efforts as Editor of Frozen Acres.

Finally, I would also like to thank the Committee for their continued hard work and support over the past year. We are fortunate to have such a great team who are willing to volunteer their time, and provide the essential support that the Club needs for its operations. I look forward to continuing to work with you all in 2020.

PART 2 - OPERATIONS

The Club's operations are directed generally by the Committee, assisted by sub-committees convened by Committee members.

FINANCES (Treasurer: Will Comensoli)

2019 Result

It is my great honour to report on the club's positive financial result for the first time after having taken on the Treasurer's role in April 2019.

The club recorded a net profit of \$138,433 for the 2019 calendar year (2018: \$89,729).

This exceptional result was driven by a couple of factors, the first being a saving on electricity costs as a result of switching our energy provider to Energy Australia. Our electricity cost for the year dropped by \$28,361 (compared to 2018). The second factor was an increase in overall accommodation revenue of \$32,188 (compared to 2018). The reason for this might reasonably be attributed to the length of the snow season with a few exciting 'dumps' in May to waken our ski-senses and significant September snowfalls which kept us coming until late in the season (unlike 2018's fast finisher, where we hardly received a snowflake in September). In addition, the consistent snow combined with strong Entrance Fees in 2018 and 2019 (\$48,559 and \$45,584 respectively) have perhaps increased the number of members booking into the lodges.

Cost centre net results, after allowing for depreciation and amortisation of \$81,252 and matching income and expenditure to the applicable year, are presented in the below table:

Capital Contributions and Entrance Fees

The contribution to the net result from Capital Contributions and Entrance Fees continues to remain critical to the Club's financial performance and its ability to pay down the Jindabyne Redevelopment Loan. For 2019 these totalled \$108,616 (2018: \$110,264).

Trading

Total income attributable to the Administration cost centre was \$55,740 comprising subscriptions of \$53,879, interest income of \$91, cancellation fees and sundry other income of \$1,770.

The administrative expenses of the Club for the year were \$59,433 with major items of expenditure being the Club's Administration Officer wages proportion of \$11,055, Frozen Acres production and distribution costs of \$8,487, audit and bank fees of \$8,648 and Booking System running costs of \$5,750. The Club contributed \$4,606 to ski development and training programs for its members throughout the year.

Perisher total revenue was \$237,327 which covered the \$223,473 running costs of this lodge. A factor which contributed to this positive result was the accrual required at year end for the January 2020 meter readings resulting in a bill of only \$18,417, a full \$17,118 less than bill received and accrued for the January 2018 meter read (due to a switch in our energy provider, and taking up a joining discount offer)¹.

Jindabyne accommodation receipts contributed income of \$125,420. Expenses were \$111,862 inclusive of Loan Interest of \$19,006 (2018: \$26,616), the Loan Line Fee of \$7,787 (2018: \$8,743) and Depreciation of \$43,361 (2018: \$42,783).

Balance Sheet

There was a net decrease in cash held for the year of \$1,548. Cash held at 31 December 2019 was \$132,801 (2018: \$134,349).

Property values are included in the Balance Sheet at cost less accumulated depreciation. At last independent market valuation (24 September 2007) the Perisher property was valued at \$1,920,000. The Jindabyne Lodge is registered on the balance sheet at cost of \$1,434,133 less Accumulated Depreciation of \$194,282.

Jindabyne Redevelopment Loan

The details of the Jindabyne Redevelopment Loan with Westpac bank are (at time of

Inclusive of the 1.05% Facility Fee, the total cost of this finance is 4.43%.

We are required to reduce the principle on this loan by \$91,000 per annum.

At 31 December 2018 the Club had paid the initial drawdown of \$1m down to \$420,000 (2018: \$550,000), after repayments of \$130,000 (2018: \$108,000).

Auditor

Mr Patrick Salter, Chartered Accountant, has provided an unqualified audit opinion on the Club's 2019 financial report.

Insurance Cover

The principal policies provide the following cover at each of the lodges:

The policy excess amounts are (generally) \$1,000. The policies provide cover to specific sub-limits for accidental damage, burglary, theft, and a range of other risks.

The Club maintains a group accident policy providing limited cover for members and persons attending organised Club work parties and other functions.

Persons representing the Club at sanctioned snow sports events or participating in Club events are generally covered under a policy maintained by Ski and Snowboard Australia. This policy also provides Public Liability cover of \$20,000,000, Professional Indemnity cover of \$2,000,000 and Management Liability cover of \$1,000,000.

The Club maintains a Voluntary Workers insurance policy which, in broad terms,

covers members on and travelling to and from working bees.

Workers Compensation insurance was maintained for NSW during the year to cover employees of the Club.

The Committee is reviewing its insurance cover in light of the recent bushfires and high winds. As at the time of writing, an insurance claim is in progress for damage to the Perisher lodge roof and skylights, which was sustained from the high winds and possibly from debris from the Beachcombers lodge roof hitting ours.

The Committee is considering adding a Cyber Insurance policy in 2020.

GOVERNANCE (Convenor: Peter Cunningham)

General Meeting

The 2019 Annual General Meeting (AGM) was conducted at the Canberra Bridge Club in Deakin on Wednesday 20 March 2019. Apart from the usual order of business, several motions on notice were put forward and carried, regarding changes to the Club's Constitution. These included removing assorted transitional clauses that were no longer relevant, changing the minimum age for Youth Membership to 18, allowing removal of Life Members who in the Club has been unable to contact, under certain circumstances, and removing the concept of leave for Committee meetings. All of these motions were subsequently ratified by a postal ballot.

Committee Changes

Mark King and Allister Polkinghorne retired at the 2019 AGM.

At the close of the 2019 AGM the Treasurer position remained unfilled. On 8 April Will Comensoli was co-opted to the Treasurer position. This left one vacant vice-president position which remained unfilled.

LODGES (Convenor: Peter Cunningham)

Perisher (Lodge Coordinator: Peter Richards)

Despite consistent effort over the year we were unable to gain completion and final

approval for the NSW Department Planning Fire Notice which was issued on the club on 11 April 2018. The Fire Notice requires full compliance with all of the 2007 Fire Order outstanding issues. The Fire Order also incorporated our plans to install a second set of stairs from the Manager's flat down to the second level, and this work was completed in 2018 and utilised during the 2019 winter. The builder returned to complete the basement beam installation and pole removal before the 2019 winter.

The Fire Engineer imposed additional requirements after his inspection in September which were completed in October/November. However we have had trouble getting final certification from the contractors to submit to the Fire Engineer for completion of his final report and then subsequent submission to the NSW Planning for final approval. It is hoped that this will be completed in early 2020.

The whole exercise has taken over two years and had been a particularly frustrating time because of the slowness of dealing with the fire safety engineers, liaising and negotiating with NSW Planning, finalising the designs and required modifications, securing builders and tradesmen at short notice and organising the required materials.

Four work parties were conducted during 2019 with a good roll-up of willing hands at each one (23/24 February, 23/24 March, 27/28 April and 23/24 November).

The major project completed during the year was the replacement of all beds in the old bedroom section in February and the ground floor of the bedroom wing in November. It is planned to replace all the beds and bedding on the bedroom wing top floor in 2020. All bedding (doonas, mattress protectors and pillows) were replaced in these bedrooms also.

Bunk beds were installed in rooms 4, 10, 11, 21, 25 and 26. These are aimed at providing more bedding flexibility for families. In the larger rooms (25 and 26), two single beds were removed and replaced with a bunk bed in each room to give more floor space. All the new mattresses are the top plush range to improve sleeping comfort.

Other work carried out during the year included general maintenance, painting, general cleaning, checking bedding, replacing pillows, bed lamps and globes as needed, removing exotic plants from our lease and the purchase of new items.

The future Perisher capital works program tendered at the 2017 AGM will progress when finances allow and after consultation with Members as to their priorities.

Jindabyne (Lodge Coordinator: Peter Cunningham)

Two working bees were conducted during 2019; 18/19 May and 9/10 November. Both work parties were very successful. The May work party was well attended, however the November work party was not as well supported.

Besides the normal maintenance activities and lodge upkeep, the major projects completed were:

- Installation of window tinting on the upstairs lake side windows to help to mitigate the summer heat
- Construction of a lockable bike shelter under the bottom decking
- New pool table installed
- New insert shelving installed in passage cupboards (Thanks to Ben Young manufacturing and installing)
- Driveway gardens tan barked and removal of cotoneaster trees and stumps in the back yard and down the lake slope
- New front entry light installed
- King bunk beds in rooms 1 & 7 relocated to rooms 4 & 10, and new standard bunks installed in rooms 1 & 7
- King single beds in rooms 4 & 10 dismantled and relocated to Perisher
- 2 extra king single beds stored under lodge relocated to Perisher

Major projects planned for 2020 are the continued investigation of a permanent deck awning, and the possible installation of a photovoltaic system.

Mount Franklin (Coordinator: Ian McLeod)

Two work parties were held during the year; one, on 4 May, before the Canberra and Region Heritage Festival Open Day, the other on 2-3 November. Most of the work was vegetation control – clearing Wombat Walk, and the ever-needed weeding – also painting the toilet block and other items. A new short track was cleared from the shelter to a border marker nearby for the Open Day, and we ran short walks around the precinct for the approximately 40 visitors.

O'Keefe's Hut (Coordinator: Paul Oboohov)

Four Club members, Paul Oboohov (O'Keefe's Officer), Ernst Willheim, Jenny Gallagher and Paul Kelly, and a guest, Geoff Lazarus travelled to O'Keefe's hut during Easter. This later time for the workparty was due to fires in the north of Kosciuszko National Park during the Canberra Day long weekend in March. Tasks

undertaken included stripping the lower walls of the main room of newspapers which had been eaten perhaps by European Wasps (in evidence for the first time), possibly because of simple flour glue having originally been used, and replacing them with whole sheets of 1930's newspapers fixed with commercial wallpaper glue; replacing missing putty to some windows; repainting the rear door; applying weather seal strips to the rear door; hanging a shovel outside next to the front door for winter visitors to be able shovel snow away from the front door; stocking the hut with firewood and packs of toilet paper; and cutting long grass along the hut sides. The workparty also hosted and entertained several walking and pushbike riding visitors around the fire outside the hut in the evenings, and climbing Mount Jagungal. On the drive out along the Grey Mare Trail, we met and talked with the relevant Ranger on his rounds, and visited Mackey's Hut.

BOOKINGS (Convenor: Jon Wilson)

Lodge Usage

As can be seen from the figures reported in Appendix 2, 2019 was another excellent year for the club in terms of bookings. This is perhaps not surprising given the excellent, and sustained, snow conditions that we experienced this year. While bookings were slightly lower than the record high we set last year, they still exceeded 6,400 bed / nights across both lodges, and represent an outstanding level of utilisation.

Despite the excellent overall results, 2019 saw a fall in the total usage of the Jindabyne lodge of approximately 9%. This is largely due to reduced off-peak usage, in the first half of the year. During June, July and August usage increased over 2018 levels, and the subcommittee believes that the updated bedding configuration is partly responsible, as the additional flexibility makes it easier to maximise utilisation of the lodge during peak period. Increased off-peak usage, particularly at Jindabyne, remains a focus area for the Bookings subcommittee.

It was pleasing to see increased usage at Perisher, with almost all months registering an increase over 2018 levels, resulting in a 6% increase overall. Both July and August registered their highest occupancy levels in recent memory, with a 100 bed/night increase each month over 2018 levels.

While the snow may not have started as early as last season, the quality of the snow, and absence of significant rain events made for many epic days on the mountain. This has translated into another year of epic bookings. For a comprehensive summary of

bookings information for this year, and comparison with previous years, please refer to Appendix 2 of the report.

Online System

The club has now completed its third full year of operation with the CBDWeb system as its centralised membership and booking system. We continue to work closely with the CBDWeb team to provide feedback and test enhancements.

For example, in 2019 we used the concept of a “family” to group together 2020 membership invoices, allowing a single family member to make one payment, rather than having to login to each member account and make separate payments. We also consolidated the separate Perisher Standard and Perisher Ensuite “lodges” into a single lodge entry, making it easier to both make, and administer, bookings at Perisher.

We also commenced a trial of a digital bunk list, with a tablet installed in the Jindabyne lobby. This digital bunk list replaces the paper bunk list, that had to be prepared, faxed, and posted on the noticeboard – sometimes multiple times per day. The digital bunk list is always up to date, showing the current room allocations, as soon as they are updated by our administrative officer. If feedback on the trial remains positive, we will look at making this a more permanent solution. On behalf of the Bookings Subcommittee, I would like to thank Andrew McIntyre for his assistance in getting this trial in place.

If you have any feedback that you would like to share about either the online system or the digital bunk list, please feel free to contact the Admin Officer.

Booking Privileges

A number of members and guests were granted booking privileges (complimentary accommodation and early confirmation of Saturday nights) which are approved by the committee. A list of these is included in Appendix 3.

These privileges are extended to the coordinators of lodge events (such as Family and Youth Weeks, and the Brumby and Championship Dinners) as well as members representing the club during races (e.g. Balmain Cup, Perisher Cup) and participating in Snowsports development programs. The club highly values all of these contributions, and these privileges represent a small “Thank You” from the club for the contribution that these members and guest have made.

The club also continued to support Nordic Shelter work parties by offering

complimentary accommodation to participants at a number of these events in 2019. We are proud to support this group, who have objectives which are closely aligned with those of the club.

Members of the subcommittee in 2019 were: Jon Wilson, Jenny McLeod and Sarah Forsdyke.

SNOWSPORTS (Convener: Colleen Turner, Club Captain: Kristen Guseli)

The club has run and participated in several events during the 2019 season. The first event of the season was the Brumby Cup run on Upper Rollercoaster on the 20th July. The female winner was Sarah Brake and the male winner was Steven Bygrave. The Brumby Cup winners were Will Brake and Sarah Brake, and the Parent/Child winners were Andrew and Lachlan Herring.

The KAC, which is run from Perisher to Charlotte Pass, is used as the XC Club Championships, and was held on the 7th August. Club Championship winners were Tim Greville and Di Jay.

The ACT Citizens Race was held on the 18th August on Mother in Law. This race is used to give the results for our Alpine and Snowboard Club Championships. The fastest female was again Sarah Brake, and the fastest male Steven Bygrave. The Balmain Cup was held on the 31st August. CAC came 3rd in the Snowboard GS (with Valentino Guseli the individual winner of the Snowboard GS), 3rd in the Cross Country, and 5th overall.

Many junior Club members competed in the Interschools competitions at regional and National level, with some excellent results.

The club actively supports the development of Snowsports by offering development grants and some complimentary accommodation to those who apply and are approved in accordance with the Snowsports guidelines. This process is undertaken by the Snowsports sub-committee.

Articles have been published throughout the season re-capping the Club races and other events. See Appendix 5 for winners of Club trophies.

When members compete for the Club in events such as Perisher Cup and Balmain Cup they can seek reimbursement for any associated costs (lift tickets, gear hire etc) and also receive complimentary accommodation (see appendix 3). Information on development grants is available on the Club website.

Elite Competition Members

Laura Peel

In January to March 2019 Laura competed in 5 World Cups, the USA National Championships held in Lake Placid, NY and the World Championships held in Deer Valley. In these events she podiumed at 3 events including gold at Shimao Lotus Mountain, China.

During summer Laura trained with the Swiss aerial team in Airolo Switzerland. During this time she progressed from double summersaults with multiple twists to triple somersaults, also with twists. Aerial skiers learn new skills jumping into water. She competed with her new skills in 3 water ramp competitions over summer, achieving two 4th places and one 3rd place.

Laura's final two competitions for 2019 were World Cup events back at Shimao Lotus Mountain, China in December, gaining a bronze medal and a 4th place.

While outside the Annual Report timeframe, in early 2020, Laura has picked up Bronze in the Europa Cup (Airolo Switzerland), 9th at the Deer Valley World Cup, Silver at the Moscow World Cup, and gold at the Raubichi World Cup. At the time of compilation of this report, Laura holds the #2 world ranking.

Valentino Guseli

Valentino competed in several international events in the 2019 Northern Hemisphere season before returning to Perisher for Winter.

During the season, 2 social events were held at Perisher; the Brumby Cup Dinner on 20 July and the Club Championship Dinner on 17 August. The Club Championship dinner was ably organised by Amanda East with lots of willing and able helpers available on the day. A great night was enjoyed by all. The Brumby Cup Dinner was catered by HQ Cuisine based in Cooma. Everyone had a great time and there was certainly plenty of lovely food. Feedback from those who attended was very positive.

The End of Year Presentation and Dinner was held on 1 November at the Old Canberra Inn in Lyneham. Members who attended really enjoyed the evening and the chance to mingle.

The social sub-Committee would like to extend a huge thank you to Melanie Callaghan who organised both the pre-season Cocktail Party and the End of Year Presentation Dinner and is always on the lookout for new and interesting venues to hold our functions.

As always, the social sub-Committee is super keen for new members to join the fun and help keep the social side of the Club interesting.

MEMBERSHIP (Convenor: Jenny McLeod)

As mentioned under Governance, the criteria for Youth Membership was amended during 2019 to raise the minimum age to 18.

Encouragingly, membership is on the rise, with a net increase of ten members (to a total of 548 across all membership categories) and no change to the overall number on the waiting list (64). There is still plenty of room for new members, so keep encouraging your interested friends to join.

Membership offers were able to be made through the year as waiters became eligible. In many cases this meant waiters progressing to provisional status early in the year as they attended work parties, and then being offered full membership late in the year, or with their subscription renewals.

PUBLIC RELATIONS (Convenor: Jenny McLeod; Frozen Acres editor: Judy Lejins; Assistant Editor: Monika Binder)

Nine issues of *Frozen Acres* were published in 2019. Members contributed articles about snow sports, hikes in the Snowy Mountains, skiing/boarding and trekking in other parts of the world and interesting accounts of Club and skiing history. Many of these were accompanied by photographs which members always enjoy viewing. Race results, junior's pages, work parties, announcement of coming events and other items of general interest to the Club were also included.

A significant number of members now receive *Frozen Acres* via email rather than as hardcopy, which helps our printing and postage costs. Contact the Admin Officer or Secretary to change to email delivery.

Monika Binder has been a back-up to the editor, while Stella has continued to proofread each item maintaining a quick turnaround of these. Jon Wilson batched and posted around 270 copies of each issue, and Jenny McLeod distributed the PDF format to around 200 email addresses. FreshCreative carry out our copy preparation for PDF, and printing.

17 Skimails were sent in 2019, covering event reminders, race information, and information on NPWS and other activities. Skimail is a useful way of getting information to members with a shorter lead time than *Frozen Acres*. The Club's Facebook group is also an important way of staying up to date and sharing information between members. The group has over 250 members, which includes some people who are not CAC members, but have an interest in the Club for various reasons.

Business cards with basic information and contact details for the Club are popular – pick up a few from the lodges and keep them in your pockets for those chairlift discussions with people who are interested in joining a club. Club logo stickers have been popular and a new run of these were printed, in two different sizes to suit

helmets, XC or alpine skis, snowboards, or other gear.

The Club again had a stall at the Snowsports Sale and Expo in May – this appears to be a useful way of raising the Club’s profile and attracting potential new members.

The Club's Personal Locator Beacon was replaced in 2019 with a newer, lighter, smaller model. The PLB was borrowed six times in 2019, with three loans for Club events and three for private trips. The PLB is available for loan to any member at no cost for bushwalking, skiing, or other expeditions, in order to improve safety for members on Club or private trips.

STRATEGIC PLANNING (Convener: Will Comensoli)

The Strategic Planning sub-committee had planned to release a ten (10) year strategic plan which will encompass all future lodge development as its central focus. It plans to issue a discussion report during 2020.

The fifth year of operation of the new Jindabyne Lodge was successful and again with positive feedback from all users. Booking numbers and revenue were in excess of the original projections.

The Club’s planning emphasis has been on the Jindabyne redevelopment for the past 5 to 10 years. At the 2017 AGM the membership indicated that their preferences moving forward for the next few years was to concentrate on the reduction of the Jindabyne loan debt as quickly as possible to put the Club back on a sound financial footing ahead of future required Perisher capital works. The loan has now been reduced from \$1M to \$420k as at 31 December 2019.

The future planned Perisher Capital works program will encompass major projects such as the extension of the dining room into the rebuilt southern deck (stage 1 completed in 2013 with the decking rebuild), refurbishment of the basement, refurbishment of the old wing bedrooms, possible installation of en-suites in the new wing lower bedrooms (plumbing and wall layout pre-installed in original construction) and a number of other smaller projects.

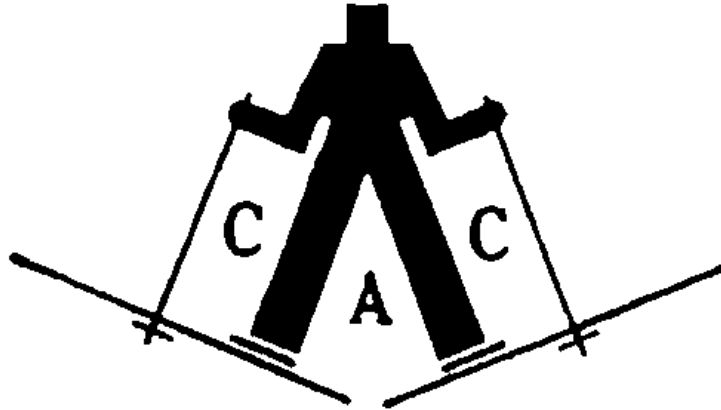

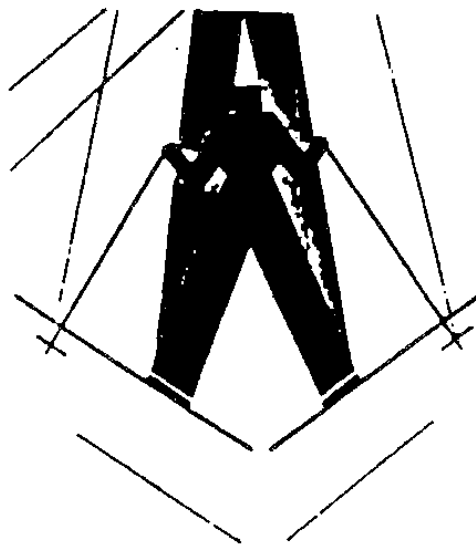

THE CLUB BADGE

The distinctive Club badge is quite unlike the badges of more recently formed ski clubs and is typical of the skiing era in which it was designed.



The original badge design, shown above, appeared in December 1936 on a brochure explaining the objects of the Club 'to the citizens of Canberra'. According to the Club's foundation Treasurer, Mr J.C. Anderson, it was adapted from the design, shown below, which appeared on the dust cover of the 1935 Ski Year Book. That design is attributed to a Mrs de Gruchy, who was said to be a member of the Ski Club of Victoria.



This original design changed after some time to a blue diamond with the skier herring-boning in yellow, thus utilising the then national colours, which have also been those of the Club for many years. These colours were adopted by the Territory upon obtaining self-Government (but ceased to be the national colours in the 1980s when the unofficial sporting colours of green and gold were formally adopted by the Commonwealth).
