# ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2023

TO BE READ IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE AUDITED ACCOUNTS SUPPLEMENT

### **Canberra Alpine Club**

The Club was formed on 31 July 1934 at the Alpine Hotel, Kiandra and was incorporated on 29 June 1955 (registration number A.19).

The motion to form the Club was put by Tim Ingram and Tom Campbell at a meeting chaired by H.J. Lamble, then Director of the NSW Government Tourist Bureau. The inaugural general meeting was held at the Hotel Canberra on 11 October 1934.

The Club is governed by a written Constitution, By-laws and the *Associations Incorporation Act 1991*. The present Constitution, which has been subject to minor amendments, was adopted in 1996 and most recently amended in 2023, and the By-laws are revised at least annually and circulated each year.

The objects of the Club include promoting snowsports and bushwalking, fostering the conservation of the alpine environment and the interest of members in matters of historical or heritage significance to skiing or bushwalking including the preservation of buildings, sites and objects.

The Club is a corporate member of Snow Australia. The Club is also a member of SLOPES (Ski Lodges of Perisher, Guthega and Smiggins Inc) and of the Kosciuszko Huts Association.

The Mount Franklin Chalet was constructed for the Club in 1938 with bunk accommodation for 32 on leased land. The Chalet reverted to the Government when Namadgi National Park was created in 1984 and was destroyed by bushfires in January 2003, with a new shelter being erected by the ACT Government in 2007. The Mount Franklin precinct is the subject of memoranda of understanding made in 1989 and 1998 between the Club and the ACT Parks and Conservation Service.

The A-frame Perisher lodge was constructed by Club labour in 1961 on land leased from the State of New South Wales. A new lease executed late in 2008 runs until 31 December 2028 – with three 10 year options exercisable after that. This lodge is licensed to accommodate 46 persons and was extended and substantially upgraded in 1983. The bedroom wing was added in 1999, together with wheelchair accessible facilities.

The original Jindabyne lodge was constructed in 1968 on leased land in Banjo Paterson Crescent, adjacent to Lake Jindabyne. Freehold title was acquired in 1992. The original lodge was demolished in late 2013 and a new lodge built, opening in 2014.

### Introduction

This report covers the 2023 calendar year, which coincides with the financial year of the Club. It should be read together with the audited financial statements for the Club's financial year ending 31 December 2023 which have been published as a supplement.

While the report formally covers the calendar year, some information is also provided regarding events between the beginning of 2024 and preparation of this report.

### PART 1 - PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I am pleased to report on the operations of the Canberra Alpine Club for the year ending 31 December 2023.

The Club has recorded revenue of \$698k, down from the record \$767k achieved in 2022, and net profit of \$136k, down from \$323k in 2022. These amounts, however, still indicate a strong financial position for the Club. The Jindabyne Redevelopment loan has been fully repaid and money is being set aside to pay for the capital works at the Jindabyne lodge and the planned redevelopment of the Perisher lodge in coming years. Bed nights occupied in 2023 were 7174, below the record 9590 reached in 2022, primarily reflecting a later start and earlier finish to the season. Full details of the Club's financial position are contained in the Treasurer's report and audited accounts.

Membership reached the Constitutional cap of 600 in May, with the out of area limit of one third also being reached at the same time. The waiting list has also increased to 134, up from 101 at the end of 2022. Currently, 42 people on the waiting list are eligible to progress to membership. The Committee has now moved to considering offers of membership once each year, in March, when it is known how many spots are available following the membership renewal period.

A number of changes to the Club's Constitution were supported at the 2023 AGM and later confirmed by postal ballot, taking effect from 1 May. These included providing for remote attendance at General and Committee meetings, raising the upper age of youth membership from 23 to 25 years of age and increasing the amount the Committee can commit the Club to from \$25,000 to \$100,000. The objectives of the Club were also broadened to encompass all snowsports and a new Club badge was adopted.

The Club's new website, incorporating the new branding, launched in May and provides up to date information to Club members and the general public, including via an Event Calendar. The website also links to the Club's booking system and to recent editions of Frozen Acres. Many thanks to Jeremy Lucas for coordinating this project.

Significant progress was made in 2023 in relation to the Club's capital works projects. The Club engaged AMC Architecture to prepare concept designs for both lodges. Following the preparation of a cost plan, approval to spend up to \$500,000 on building work at the Jindabyne lodge including cladding, window awnings, a pergola and improved ventilation was provided at an Extraordinary

General Meeting held in early December. A contract was signed with builders to commence building in early 2024 with a view to the work being completed ahead of the winter season. A massive thanks to Peter Cunningham, Amanda East and Jeremy Lucas for all their efforts to date with this work.

Desktop building insurance valuations for the Club's two lodges were undertaken in 2023 prior to undertaking insurance renewals. Perisher's total replacement cost is now \$8.49 million while Jindabyne's is \$3.64 million. The Club's 2024 insurance premiums will rise to \$115k in 2024, up from \$94k in 2023.

A number of very successful social activities and snowsports events were held during 2023. Pre-season drinks were held in May at Maddies at the Kingston Hotel, the Winter Warmer was held at the Jindabyne lodge in June, and a post season BBQ picnic and presentation event was held in October at Black Mountain Peninsular. The Club Alpine and Snowboard Championships was held in July, in conjunction with Cooma Ski Club, with the inaugural Canberra/Cooma Cup being shared between the Clubs with both clubs winning 4 disciplines. The XC Championships and Brumby Cup race and dinner were held in August. The Club hosted the Balmain Cup in September, coming second by the narrowest of margins. And the Club was also well represented in the Perisher Cup, including by a team spanning 3 generations of members! Many thanks to social convenor Cheryl Taylor and Club Captain Sarah Brake for their amazing contributions in organising these events and to everyone else who helped out. Youth and Family weeks in the school holidays were also a great success and I would like to record my thanks to organisers Chrissie Young, Lexie Phillips, Melissa Randall and Lachie Hatch.

Congratulations to the Club's international athletes, Laura Peel, Valentino Guseli, Bently Walker-Broose and Tuva Bygrave for their efforts during both the 2022-23 and 2023-24 seasons, with a special mention of Val's incredible 22-23 season which culminated with him earning the overall Park and Pipe Crystal Globe. He was also named joint Male Athlete of the year, joint Junior Athlete of the year and won the Alex 'Chumpy' Pullin Outstanding Achievement Award at the 2023 Snow Australia Awards.

I would like to congratulate Jenny McLeod on being awarded Honorary Life Membership of the Club at the 2023 AGM. And I would like to congratulate Jeremy Lucas on being awarded the Lane Poole trophy in 2023. Congratulations also to all our other 2023 trophy winners.

I would like to pass my condolences on behalf of the Club to the families of the members and former members that passed during 2023. In particular, I would like to note the passing of Honorary Life Member John Tilley, Gold Member John Pascall, and Associated Ex-member Bern Brent.

I would like to thank Perisher Lodge Coordinator Peter Richards, Jindabyne Lodge Coordinator Peter Cunningham, Franklin Coordinator Jenny McLeod and O'Keefe's Hut Coordinator Paul Oboohov for their continued hard work throughout 2023. I would also like to thank all the volunteers who attended work parties, and those who served as lodge leaders. In particular, a massive thanks to Andrew Cupit, Ian Elvin and Gavin Williams for their efforts in repairing the stonework at the Perisher lodge.

Heartfelt thanks to our Admin Officer Vicki Hughes for an outstanding effort over the entire year. Thanks also to Judy Lejins (Editor) and James Muldowney (Assistant Editor) for the 6 editions of Frozen Acres produced during 2023 and to Jenny McLeod for creating and distributing 20 Skimail newsletters. I would also like to thank Public Officer Lindy Down.

And many, many thanks to Jill and Ken French, who continued their management of Perisher Lodge during the 2023 Winter, their 40th winter with the Club – a truly remarkable achievement. Their outstanding contribution of 40 years service to the Club will be celebrated on the opening weekend of the 2024 season.

Finally, I would like to thank all Committee members for their efforts during a very busy 2023. Across areas including finance, lodges, bookings, membership, snowsports and social, Committee members have helped ensure we all continue to enjoy the benefits of Club membership.

### **PART 2 - OPERATIONS**

The Club's operations are directed generally by the Committee, assisted by sub-committees convened by Committee members.

### FINANCES (TREASURER: WILL COMENSOLI)

2023 Result

I am pleased to report that the club has maintained its strong financial position during 2023 with an operating surplus of \$136,375 (2022: \$322,686). The surplus was recorded after providing for depreciation of \$103,631 (2022: \$86,988) and interest of \$2,201 (2022: \$1,707).

The 2023 season was plagued with poor snow during key months of the season in July and August. I personally was at the lodge during August when the road had all but melted and you had to walk to Sundeck to get the front valley. That same trip, only a day or two later, we received a significant dump of snow which should have revived the season. Bed nights unfortunately did not recover after the poor snow mid season, and this was a factor in the reduction in our annual accommodation revenue for Perisher to \$300,083 (2022: \$337,514) and Jindabyne to \$151,099 (2022: \$180,941).

Our insurance premiums again skyrocketed for the third year in a row since the bushfires to \$90,708 (2022: \$73,960).

Wages and Salaries \$78,437 (2022: 53,761) and Super \$8,471 (2022: \$5,609) were up in 2023 as a result of increases consistent with the Fair Work Commission's Annual Wage Review and the addition of Ken French onto the payroll in recognition of the work he undertakes for the Club.

National Parks Rental Charges were \$38,029 (2022: \$35,532) reflecting higher revenue level in 2022 compared to 2021.

Cost centre net results, after allowing for depreciation and amortisation of \$103,631 and matching income and expenditure to the applicable year, are presented in the below table:

#### Balance Sheet

There was a net increase in cash held for the year of \$232,587 (2022: \$259,202) a decrease in this year's overall surplus has been offset by the reduced debt repayments required now the Jindabyne Redevelopment loan has been paid off. Cash held at 31 December 2023 was \$716,525 (2022: \$483,939).

Property values are included in the Balance Sheet at cost less accumulated depreciation. A Valuation was conducted in 2022 which replaced the old 2007 valuations. The Perisher property was valued at \$7,890,000 based on replacement value (2007: \$1,920,000). The Jindabyne Lodge was valued at \$3,320,000. Note it is registered on the balance sheet at cost of \$1,472,744 less Accumulated Depreciation of \$337,743.

Demand for Club Membership remains strong and the Club's waitlist has been strong throughout the year. With entrance fees strong again in 2023 these were a major contributor to this year's surplus.

### Jindabyne Redevelopment Loan

At 31 December 2023 the Club has now paid down and closed the Jindabyne Redevelopment loan of \$1M (2022: \$5,000 owing).

In light of proposed capital works in the next few years, the Club will be engaging with a range of lenders to consider debt financing assistance regarding the cash flow shortages that we expect to incur if we undertake capital works at the Perisher lodge.

#### **Auditor**

Mr Patrick Salter, Chartered Accountant, has provided an unqualified audit opinion on the Club's 2023 financial report.

#### Insurance Cover

The principal policies provide the following cover at each of the lodges:

The policy excess amounts are (generally) \$1,000. The policies provide cover to specific sub-limits for accidental damage, burglary, theft, and a range of other risks.

Persons representing the Club at sanctioned snow sports events or participating in Club events are generally covered under a policy maintained by Ski and Snowboard Australia. This policy also provides Public Liability cover of \$20,000,000, Professional Indemnity cover of \$2,000,000 and Management Liability cover of \$1,000,000.

The Club maintains a Voluntary Workers insurance policy which, in broad terms, covers members on and travelling to and from working bees. Workers Compensation insurance was maintained for NSW during the year to cover the employees of the Club.

I extend my heartfelt gratitude to all Club Members who generously volunteer their time to the club, whether this be at work parties, on an ad-hoc basis, or on a more involved basis. Assistance with maintaining supplies, cleanliness, capital works and maintenance programs and assisting other clubs. Your commitment is a reflection of the strong positive culture that defines the Canberra Alpine Club.

### **GOVERNANCE** (Convenor: Caroline Walker)

The 2023 AGM approved changes to the Club's Constitution dealing with remote attendance at General and Committee meetings, raising the upper age of Youth Members from 23 to 25 years of age, increasing the limit on the costs the Committee can commit the Club to without AGM approval from \$25,000 to \$100,000, broadening the scope of the Club's objectives to include all snowsports, adopting a new Club logo and assorted other

changes. These changes were confirmed by postal ballot and took effect from 1 May.

The Committee has adopted a delegation policy which sets out amounts Committee members and office holders are authorised to spend, including amounts approved under specific subcommittee budgets.

### Annual General Meeting

The 2023 Annual General Meeting (AGM) was held at the Canberra Bridge Club on Wednesday 22 March 2023, as a hybrid in-person and online meeting. The hybrid format again worked well, with 42 attendees in person and 32 participating via Zoom.

### Extraordinary General Meeting

An Extraordinary General Meeting (EGM) was held at the Canberra Bridge Club on Wednesday 6 December 2023, as a hybrid in-person and online meeting, to discuss proposed Jindabyne Lodge capital works. A motion to authorise the Committee to spend up to \$500,000 on the proposed works was authorised at this meeting.

### Committee Changes

The Committee remained largely unchanged in 2023, with the only change being the departure of Jon Wilson after his term of Immediate Past President.

### **LODGES** (Convenor: Peter Cunningham)

Lodge activity centred on maintenance activities with limited capital works completed while the Club is finalising the 5 Year Capital Works program.

All work parties held during 2023 were extremely well supported, in fact oversubscribed, and this was due to two main factors:

- The very large number of waiters presently on the membership list,
- The modification to the Booking Rules in 2022 which gave early preference to Tier 1 bookings once the annual bookings are opened.

### Perisher (Lodge Coordinator: Peter Richards)

Four work parties were conducted during 2023 with a great roll-up of willing hands at each one (18/19 February, 18/19 March and 2/3 December). Weeding parties, facilitated by Amanda East, were held on 6/7 January and 7-8 May, and the condition of the building's surrounds continues to improve with the regular weeding.

A major focus over the past 12 months has been the completion of re-oiling of the bedroom wing external timber walls and the end timbers of the A-frame building by Club labour which resulted in savings of approximately \$30k. The A-frame bases were also inspected and creosoted. Other work completed included removing the old window coverings and preparing the windows for new curtains and blinds (timber work filled and varnished inside and oiled outside). The new curtains and blinds were professionally installed.

New artwork was printed and hung in several of the rooms, with the ongoing artwork replacement being led by James Muldowney.

The Club has been unsuccessful in sourcing professional stone masons to work on the granite rock walls because of the difficulty of the project and the approximate cost of \$200k in labour. However, work was completed on 25 Feb 2024 on major repairs to all the granite walls of the Perisher Lodge.

These walls were in a serious state of decay. This work was started with a trial in early 2023 using some newer products on the window sills of the new wing and the southern buttress wall. This work was assessed in late 2023 to be satisfactory. Two club members, Ian Elvin and Andrew Cupit, then undertook to repair the rest of the stone walls over a number of weeks during the summer period of 2023/24. Ian is a stone mason with considerable experience and expertise. Over a dozen large rocks that had fallen out were restored and many deep cracks and holes were filled.

Finally, the entire surface has been repointed. Some assistance was provided by other members at work parties to prepare walls and help clean up. Scaffolding was provided by a club member, Gavin Williams, who is a builder. Gavin's team built and dismantled the scaffolding for the stone repair work in all high areas. Given the considerable damage to the walls, the extreme weather conditions, and the uncertainty of stone masonry repair methods it is difficult to determine how long these repairs may last. This work will be reassessed in November 2024.

Gavin Williams' team also moved the doorway to the BBQ deck so that it fully opened and also replaced flooring in this entrance.

A leaking window in the Manager's flat causing damage to the lounge room and bay window was repaired. This has identified the requirement to replace these windows. Some roof screws in the main roof were damaged by ice and replaced, this will be monitored with the possibility that the roofs battens may need replacement. This project and the Manager's Flat window replacement have both been added to the Five Year Capital Works program.

Perisher has had a refresh of kitchen items including a coffee machine, glassware and matching cutlery and crockery, thanks to the efforts of Jeremy Lucas. A Starlink satellite service was installed in late 2023, providing wi-fi connectivity through the building.

Jindabyne (Lodge Coordinator: Peter Cunningham)

Three working bees were conducted during 2023 – 4/5 February, 6/7 May and 12/13 November and all were very well attended. The main minor maintenance completed were new garden tan bark, new heaters in rooms 3 and 4, and internal painting and repairs.

Wifi connectivity has been installed, with coverage throughout the Jindabyne lodge.

Mount Franklin (Coordinator: Jenny McLeod)

Work parties were held at Mt Franklin in February, April, October and November. The April work party was a one-day work party followed by an ACT Heritage Festival Open Day the following day (in very wet weather). Apart from general weeding and track clearing, work parties also completed widening of the (public) track from the summit to the Austin, and replaced the ski storage rack in the shelter – the chipboard used as cross-pieces on the previous rack had gradually absorbed water and was losing strength. Wombat Walk has also been more obviously marked (except at the beginning and end), and preliminary marking done for a possible uphill track from the shelter hut ruins up the Slalom Run.

O'Keefe's Hut (Coordinator: Paul Oboohov)

The Club organised a workparty at O'Keefe's Hut on the Canberra Day Long Weekend in 2023, consisting of Paul Oboohov, Helen Jennings and Michael Griffiths. Michael cut a sheet of 'Scyon' fireproof flooring to fit above the new box shaped stove, to prevent heat loss through the metal clad fireplace chimney. Helen and Michael painted linseed oil on all externally exposed timber, including window frames, roof bearers, roof end pieces, and wooden steps at both doors. The rear door paintwork was in tatters, and was sanded back on all surfaces, and white undercoat paint applied. We did not have time or spare labour to apply further coats of paint. Fallen timber was gathered to restock the large wood box inside the entrance room of the hut, as well as an old circular water tank that was stood on its side across the grass from the front door. A battery powered whipper snipper was used to cut the grass around the hut to minimise bushfire risk. A battery powered projector was

used to show Paul's photos from an attempted 'Kiandra to Kosciuszko' cross country ski trip in 2002 by him and others from the Canberra Cross Country Ski Club, to an audience of young bushwalkers. Michael had prepared photos from his 1981 'K to K' cross country ski trip, but his USB stick was unreadable by the projector, so he narrated his story of the trip, which made it to Mount Kosciuszko.

### **CAPITAL PROJECTS** (Convenor: Peter Cunningham)

The Capital Projects Work Group (CPWG) continued work on the Five Year Capital works program conducting 10 meetings during 2023.

### The main projects are:

- Perisher Basement refurbishment
- Perisher Sunroom/Dining room extension
- Perisher Kitchen refurbishment.
- Jindabyne Recladding

Major milestones achieved during the year were:

- December 2022 Structural engineer assessment of the Jindabyne Lodge which reported no structural problems.
- June 2023 the Committee shortlisted and engaged AMC Architecture to provide services for the proposed Jindabyne and Perisher capital works. After site visits to both lodges, AMC advised that capital works to Jindabyne should be undertaken as a high priority and as soon as possible to protect the exterior and prevent structural damage to the building.
- August 2023 AMC presented a concept design for the Jindabyne lodge, incorporating input from structural engineers, Sellick Consultants.
- Late September 2023 Aaron Still Consulting presented their opinion of probable costs for the building materials and labour totalling \$407,500 (excluding contingencies and GST).
- Mid-October 2023 Seven builders were identified to undertake the work and 3 builders returned proposals with estimated costs.
- SMRC DA approval received on 24 November 2023.
- Contract signed with Canberra builder Manteena on 14 December 2023. Based on current available information the anticipated total material and labour costs to be in the order of \$470,000.

At the March 2023 AGM a motion authorising \$250,000 expenditure on the Jindabyne cladding project was authorised by Members. Following the completion of detailed estimates in September an EGM was held on 6 December where the authorised expenditure was increased to up to

\$500,000. The increased authorisation is because of higher building costs and an increased job scope to include solutions to address the overheating issues experienced during summer.

The Jindabyne Cladding project will:

- Clad the lodge with permanent Colourbond sheeting, based on the design by the original architect.
- Replace window awnings with permanent metal alternatives;
- Install an automated louvered pergola, structurally engineered to withstand extreme weather conditions over the upper deck;
- Erect a backlit signage of the new club logo.

The works program is to commence in February/March 2024 with completion by May 2024 for the ski season. The lodge will be closed during this period. The Jindabyne Recladding project will be financed from Club savings. The three major Perisher projects (dining room/sunroom extension, kitchen refurbishment and the basement refurbishment) are in the concept design and planning stages and will require NSW Department of Planning Development Applications and builder engagement. Consultation will occur with Members over 2024 to finalise the designs, construction program and timing. The Club is presently investigating possible financing options. The earliest expected construction commencement date is early 2025.

### **BOOKINGS** (Convenor: Caroline Walker) *Lodge Usage*

As can be seen from the figures reported in Appendix 2, 2023 saw solid lodge usage, albeit below 2022's record levels. With 2,735 bed/nights in Jindabyne and 4,439 bed/nights in Perisher, Jindabyne was 32% higher and Perisher 18% higher than the 10-year average.

The solid increase in off-peak usage in 2022 was broadly maintained in 2023 and will remain a focus in coming years.

Lodge utilisation remains incredibly important in maintaining the financial viability of the Club, as it provides the bulk of the funds that the Club needs to invest into maintenance, as well as capital improvements and renovations. The solid levels of bookings in 2022 and 2023 have allowed the work scheduled to be completed at Jindabyne in 2024 to be internally financed.

### **Booking System**

In 2023, the bookings subcommittee conducted an evaluation of the existing CBDWeb booking system against a potential replacement system, Clubman.

While pros and cons of both systems were identified, on balance, the subcommittee considered there was not a sufficiently compelling case for moving from CBDWeb to Clubman at this time.

A member password for CBDWeb was introduced in 2023 to improve system security.

In 2022, the Committee introduced a new schedule for booking opening and cut-off dates, along with different tiers for confirmation. The purpose of these changes is to improve equity and access for members, while simultaneously reducing the administrative load for our Admin Officer. Feedback from members received on these changes in relation to 2023 bookings has been broadly positive and has also resulted in some minor adjustments, including permitting children eligible for offers of membership and those under 5 who are on the waiting list to be included in tier 1 bookings.

### **Booking Privileges**

A small number of members and guests were granted booking privileges (complimentary accommodation and early confirmation of Saturday nights). A list of these is included in Appendix 3.

These privileges are typically extended to the coordinators of lodge events (such as Family and Youth Weeks, the Winter Warmer and the Brumby Dinner) as well as members representing the Club during races (e.g. Balmain Cup, Perisher Cup) and participating in Snowsports development programs.

The Club also supports Nordic Shelter work parties by offering complimentary accommodation to participants. We were proud to be able to continue our support of this community in 2023.

# **SNOWSPORTS** (Convener: Yvette Lejins, Club Captain: Sarah Brake) 2023 Events

Under the leadership of Sarah Brake (who evidently has no ski-brake given her results year on year), a fabulous series of Club events were held. Snow conditions were not as favourable as other years, so some events changed from normal location or were even cancelled. The highlights of a great year of racing and participation included:

Club Championships – 30th July 2023 (Held in conjunction with Cooma Ski Club on Mother-in-law at Guthega). Both Clubs won four disciplines each. Big call out to the Bodell / Court family who had great success in the snowboard section.

KAC Classic – 7<sup>th</sup> August. As the snow conditions were not great, the Classic was held on the trails near the Nordic trail – rather than the road to Charlotte Pass. The Greville family made their mark!

The family favorite dual slalom – the Brumby Cup was held on 12<sup>th</sup> August. Always a very fun event for participants and spectators.

A Mediterranean dinner was held at the Perisher lodge to mark the event and the results.

Balmain Cup - 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2023. CAC placed second overall behind Cooma Ski Club.

CAC won the Club Snowboard Giant Slalom. The winning team included Valentino Guseli, Alistair Court, Jet Lange, Ric Guseli, Ali Guseli and Nina Lange.

CAC came second in the Club Cross Country. (Bentley Walker-Broose, Ivar Berget, Tim Greville, Harriet Greville, David Hislop and Jenny McLeod).

Perisher Cup – 16<sup>th</sup> September 2023. Due to lack of snow, just the slalom and jump were held, with no cross-country leg. Two CAC teams competed, one of guests, the other of three generations of the East/Frain/Cowie family, winning the Perisher Pot for most improved Club.

See Appendix 5 for all winners of Club trophies.

In addition - Many junior Club members competed in the Interschools competitions at regional, State and National level, with some excellent results including a number of gold, silver and bronze individual and team medals.

### Snowsports programs

The club actively supports the development of Snowsports by offering development grants and some complimentary accommodation to those who apply and are approved in accordance with the Snowsports guidelines. This process is undertaken by the Snowsports sub-committee.

### Elite Competition Level

Two athletes were awarded Elite Competition grants – Laura Peel (Aerial skier) and Valentino Guseli (Snowboard).

Both Laura and Valentino have enjoyed incredible international success in their respective disciplines. It's fair to say every Club member is super proud of their successes. Many Club members have cheered them in person, but many more from afar. Laura was ranked 2<sup>nd</sup> in Women's aerials at the end of 2023. She had a huge 2023 competing in China, Finland, USA, Switzerland, Kazakhstan, Georgia, and Canada. Cementing her career as a three-time Olympian and two-time aerial world champion. She has also just been appointed to the AIS Athlete Advisory Committee. "I'm looking forward to listening and learning from other athletes and exploring new ideas to be able to best respond to athlete needs in a changing environment and give athletes a voice in shaping the future of high performance sport in Australia."

Val had an incredible 2023 and is leaving his mark in the world snowboard community as a household name. It has culminated in him winning in February 2024 the Halfpipe World Cup victory in Canada. Valentino now has eight career World Cup medals across the three park and pipe disciplines of halfpipe, slopestyle, and big air, with one victory so far in each of the halfpipe and big air disciplines.

### **SOCIAL** (Convenor: Cheryl Taylor)

It has been an enjoyable year with successful Social activities dotted across the calendar months. Some additional members joined the sub-committee and they have helpfully assisted with the organisation and promotion of social get-togethers during 2023.

Lis Hemming has been an enthusiastic new addition to the Club and to Social Sub-committee. Her cheery approach & energy have been a great support and Amanda East provided some experience and "sage" advice. We repeated some trusty favourite events, reintroduced a past favourite and created, hopefully, a new favourite.

The Pre-season Social drinks and nibbles at The Kingston Hotel was well attended on Sun 14th of May. It was a pleasant way to kick off the season in the relaxed atmosphere of the Maddies Library area at the Kingo!

The inaugural "Winter Warmer" in June was a great hit. The official "opening weekend" in June attracts members to the local festivals. The outdoor lawn area, at Jindabyne Lodge, was the perfect location for a firepit. The weather was fine and cool, ideal for warming fingers by the fire whilst chewing on a BBQ sausage. The outdoor fire became the focal point for the members staying at the lodge. It was an enjoyable evening relaxing in the outdoor setting, sharing stories and sipping on a warm drink or licking chocolatey fingers after toasting marshmallows and constructing "s'mores".

In August we hosted the Brumby Cup dinner at Perisher Lodge. A fantastic

feast was created and eaten post the race day. After dessert, excitement & laughter followed with the announcement of race winners.

The highlight of the calendar was the Presentation Picnic on Sun 29th of October. The combined picnic to present trophies and celebrate with the winners in snow sports or for participation in Club activities, was a fun and relaxed affair. The picnic & playground area at Black Mountain Peninsula was the perfect location and we were blessed with beautiful sunshine and balmy spring afternoon weather. It was a casual event attended by approximately 50 members who enjoyed an Aussie BBQ and picnic food, whilst clapping the trophy winners.

Thank you again to the 2023 social sub-committee of Cheryl Taylor, Lis Hemming, Amanda East, Rhonda Cunningham & Colleen Turner, for your help and participation on behalf of the club, in bringing these occasions to fruition.

### **MEMBERSHIP** (Convenor: Jenny McLeod)

Membership has increased again this year, and is now effectively at the limit of 600 members, only dropping below that number late in the year due to notification of the deaths of two members. There has also been a sustained increase in the number of people on the waiting list, which increased from 101 to 134. As well as sitting at the total membership limit, the Club is also at the limit of "out of area" members, with a third of members residing outside the 160km limit. As a result, people wishing to join the Club who reside outside the 160km limit are likely to face a lengthy, possibly indefinite, wait to be able to become a member.

Statistics on membership numbers are in part 3 of this report.

### Honorary Life Membership

Jenny McLeod was elected as an Honorary Life Member at the 2023 AGM, in recognition of her significant contributions to the Club. These include serving on the Committee for over 20 years, including in the role of Secretary for over a decade, as well as terms as President and Vice President. Jenny has also made significant contributions to the Club's racing and social activities.

#### **Obituaries**

The Committee records with regret the deaths, in 2023, of Bern Brent (Associated Ex-member), John Pascall (Gold Member), and John Tilley (Honorary Life Member). We were also notified of the earlier death of Life Member David Ledger.

Re-admission to Membership

Two members or Associated Ex-Members requested re-admission in 2023 after their membership had lapsed.

**PUBLIC RELATIONS** (Convenor: Jenny McLeod; Frozen Acres editor: Judy Lejins; Assistant Editor: James Muldowney)

The Club's new branding was delivered in 2023, including a new logo (approved by members at the AGM and by postal vote), new website, and merchandise. Thank you to Jeremy Lucas and Gina Quadraccia for the significant time and effort that went into this. It was great to see plenty of members wearing the new t-shirts, hoodies, and other clothing. Business cards with basic information and contact details for the Club are available, with the new Club logo.

Six issues of *Frozen Acres* were printed and sent out to members during 2023. While most of the copies are emailed to members by Jenny McLeod, a small number are also posted to members who have opted to receive them as a booklet. Thanks to Jon Wilson who batches and posts these. Thanks to those members, adult, youth and juniors, who have provided contributions.

20 Skimails were sent in 2023; these let members know about social events, races, reminders, and many other items.

The Club's Facebook group was another way of providing updates to members, and with 169 posts made during the year, it was well-used by members to discuss issues, advertise the new Club merchandise, report snow conditions and race results, let others know about Club events and other events of interest, and post some excellent photos. It was also used to celebrate achievements and share clips of athletes such as Laura and Val. The group has over 370 members.

The Club's Personal Locator Beacon was borrowed seven times in 2023, for Mt Franklin work parties and for private trips. The PLB is available for loan to any member at no cost for bushwalking, skiing, or other expeditions, in order to improve safety for members on Club or private trips.



### THE CLUB BADGE

The Club badge has had several iterations prior to the current version.



The original badge design, shown above left, appeared in December 1936 on a brochure explaining the objects of the Club 'to the citizens of Canberra'. According to the Club's foundation Treasurer, Mr J.C. Anderson, it was adapted from the design, shown above right, which appeared on the dust cover of the 1935 Ski Year Book. That design is attributed to a Mrs de Gruchy, who was said to be a member of the Ski Club of Victoria.



This original design changed after some time to the design above, a blue diamond with the skier herring-boning in yellow, thus utilising the then national colours, which have also been those of the Club for many years. These colours were adopted by the Territory upon obtaining self-Government (but ceased to be the national colours in the 1980s when the unofficial sporting colours of green and gold were formally adopted by the Commonwealth). This design was used until 2023, when the present design (shown on the front cover of this report) was adopted.
